California Taking Steps to Ban Common Fishing Gear

On September 12, 2014, the California Department of Toxic Substance Control (DTSC) released its draft Priority Product Work Plan, a program of the California Green Chemistry Initiative. The Draft Work Plan is the first release of Governor Jerry Brown's Green Chemistry Initiative, which would ban seven product types, including fishing sinkers and gear that contain metals such as lead, zinc and copper. The new regulations if passed would ban the manufacturing, distribution and sale of popular fishing gear, and would expect to drive their costs up 20-fold!

With only an estimated 100 public comments and 1,100 online petition signatures submitted by anglers, the DTSC is expected to make its final ruling in January 2015 and present its recommendations to Governor Jerry Brown for review. With little response from anglers, the proposed ban is sure to be passed. When you consider that there are over 1.8 million licensed anglers in California, less than 0.06% of licensed anglers signed the petition against the proposed lead ban.

Vagabond 10 day Oct 2014

We had another fun-filled 10 day trip aboard Mike Lackeys "Vagabond" docked at Point Loma Sportfishing. We only had 14 aboard on this years trip as Bob and Theresa could not make it. Our group included Debbie and Dwayne, Tony Shanley, Paul White, John Gleaves, Bill Rinkes, Charley Fouquette, Charley Rose, Mike Sur, Steve Kohl, John Nakatani, Randy Tippin, Tim Macauley, and Mark Mayo. We took off from Point Loma after the normal 2 hour bait up at Everingham and Skipper Mike got on the radio to gather information to make a game plan for the next 10 days. This years hot spot was Alijos Rocks for wahoo and the boats had made a deal amongst themselves to only have one long range boat at a time at the rocks so the wahoo, which become very boat shy with a lot of boat traffic, would be easier to catch. Our "Golden Ticket" was set for early in our trip so after a short stop at Geronimo Island, just south of San Quintin for yellows and bass, we motored across to the Rocks. Later that afternoon, Skipper Mike found us 2 paddies that were loaded with nice sized dorado and everyone had a good time. Then the wahoo moved in and the excitement level increased dra-matically as the big wahoo were slashing everything thrown in the water and was being gobbled up and then sawed off! We ended up boating about 10 out of the 30 hook ups that we had. What a way to start the trip with adrenalin pumping wahoo fishing!. The sun went down and the next morning we arrived at the Rocks about mid morning. It did not take long for Mike to find the wahoo and we worked on those fish for two days. The afternoons were definitely better as they seemed to suddenly school up and were easier to find. We finally worked the kinks out and were able to consistently put those escape artists on the deck with some consistency. We left the rocks with everyone satisfied with catching wahoo and slipped away in the evening heading for the ridge. We were treated for the next 3 days of great yellowfin tuna fish-ing, so good at one point I only counted 6 people fishing as everyone was tired and licking their wounds. We worked our way up the ridge toward Cedros island hoping to find some yellowtail along the way, which at this point had been difficult to find in that warm 85 degree water. We picked away at a few and finally reached Cedros in the dark. The die-hards like John Nakatani, John Gleaves, Paul White and Kohl decided to fish about midnight. Fishing was slow and some went to bed. About 1 am the big yellows started to bite and the lucky ones who stayed up were rewarded with some great fishing for great BIG fish until sunrise. We hung around for awhile and picked away at some yellowtail. Then in the afternoon Mike found OUTSTANDING yellowtail fishing for everyone on board. Everything we threw was pretty much engulfed including surface poppers that Randy was throwing. Exhausted, Mike moved the boat to a calm place for dinner and a little bit of yellows and bass as the sun went down. We took off for Sacramento reef by Geronimo Island so we could finish off the trip the next morning with some calico fishing and a lone white seabass that Nakatani caught when we first arrived. Mid morning was upon us and reluctantly we had to pull the plug on the trip and start to head home. 2014 BASS SLAM TOURNAMENT RULES AND ENTRY FORM

November 15th, 2014

Tournament channel 72

PAGE 1 OF 2

1. The official starting time of the tournament is **6:00am on Saturday, November 15, 2014**. The official ending time of the tournament is **3:00pm on Saturday, November 15th 2014**.
2. Boats may depart prior to the official starting time of the tournament. Boats must depart from and return to any port within the county of San Diego. No tournament fishing is allowed prior to the official tournament starting time.
3. The fishing boundaries of the tournament shall be San Diego Bay to an imaginary line from Zuniga jetty to the tip of Point Loma. No fishing within 100 yards of bait barge or in MLPA area at the tip of Point Loma
4. **During the tournament fishing can be done from any fishing platform.**
5. Bait may be caught, purchased or acquired as available prior to the official tournament starting time. Bait may be kept aboard tournament boats, used or transferred at the discretion of the anglers or skippers throughout the tournament.
6. California Department of Fish & Game regulations will be used for this tournament. IGFA angling rules apply, **No exceptions**. Angling rules can be found in the San Diego Anglers Yearbook under General Angling Rules. Anglers are responsible for compliance of California and Mexican, fishing and boating laws/regulations.
7. Transferring of anglers and fish from a disabled boat is allowed to comply with rule #8 or to continue to fight a hooked fish.
8. Anglers must report in person with the Tournament Weigh master with their fish ready for weighing no later than the official ending time of the tournament.
9. **Species: Calico bass, Sand Bass, & Spotted Bay Bass.** (\$10.00 Optional jackpot for heaviest Halibut or heaviest single bass if no Halibut are caught). **All fish must be weighed on the Club scale between 2:00pm & 3:00pm at the San Diego Anglers Tournament weigh station located at SHELTER ISLAND LAUNCH RAMP.**
10. **Prizes will be awarded in the following Categories: Heaviest 2 fish sack (1 sand bass and 1 Spotted Bay Bass). 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th place for adults; 1st, 2nd and 3rd for juniors. There will be no ties in any category. When two sacks of bass of the same weight are submitted, the first fish weighed is considered the winner. Regardless of weight 2 Bass combination beats 1 Bass.**
11. All anglers are responsible to stay aware of current weather/sea conditions. Monitor NOAA weather radio for info.
12. **All tournament anglers must complete, sign and submit a Tournament Entry Form prior to wetting a line in this fishing tournament and complete Boat Insurance Info on back of entry form prior to fishing the tournament including the policy's ending date and time. NO VERBAL ENTRIES INTO TOURNAMENT ACCEPTED.**
13. **The entry forms must be turned into the locations or persons listed on the back of this form by 5:00pm, Friday November 14th with the Tournament Director or Fisherman's Landing Tackle Shop.** All entrants in the tournament must be current members in good standing or non-members fishing their first introductory tournament as a guest of a San Diego Angler club member. Entry forms can be scanned and emailed to Tournament Director (Dave Hanes) with all pertinent signatures, boat insurance info if applicable, date and time stamp. By signing the application, applicant does assume all risks of injury or property damage, and does agree to hold the San Diego Anglers harmless should any injury, death or property damage occur.
14. Failure to comply with any of these rules will result in the offending angler's disqualification from the tournament and possible termination of club membership.
15. **Tournament Angler, Angler of the Year and Skipper points will be awarded for this tournament.**

4. Any protest, except weight, must be filed in writing with the protest committee no later than 24 hours after the ending time of the tournament. The protest may be filed with any member of the protest committee.
